From the Director *Mike Mabe*

Years ago, my grade school teacher shared the inspirational story of Thomas Edison and his invention of the nickel-alkaline storage battery to stress the importance of hard work and facing challenges on our young developing minds. One night, after years of working on the battery, spontaneous combustion caused the chemicals in Edison's production plant to ignite, causing the entire plant to go up in flames. While watching the plant burn to the ground, Edison realized that ten years of effort and all his available resources to rebuild were gone in a few violent moments. Staying true to his personal determination to succeed, Edison boldly announced the next day that they would rebuild and start again.

Jim Haudan, the author of "The Art of Engagement" teaches clients that, "regardless of how sharp, clever or talented we are, we will all encounter struggles, challenges, difficulties, and at times, heart-wrenching moments that cannot be avoided." It is during difficult times, Haudan counsels, that the discomfort from those personal challenges and adversity force us to rethink what's required to succeed.

But we are also aware that many of you have begun to rethink what is required for you to succeed. We sense and feel your discomfort and we have been motivated by your stories of starting again. CCPL Learning Pods

In support of families with school age children, Chesterfield County Public Library is providing virtual learning spaces for students, families and teleworkers. CCPL is committed to being a partner in supporting learning for all, especially as schools and families adapt to this new learning environment. Providing quiet spaces for individual learning, larger spaces for group learning, and additional wireless access are just some of many ways CCPL can help support the learning experience.

Spaces will be available for reservation from 7 a.m.-3 p.m., Monday-Friday, and 10 a.m.-2 p.m. on Saturdays. Hours will be expanded into the evening starting in October.

Learning spaces will be available at all ten locations (even locations that are still closed to the public). Services will vary by location, depending on whether the location is open to the public. Curbside service will continue to be offered at all 10 branches.


Who may want to use this space:

- Parents and children who need more reliable wifi for virtual learning or need a learning space outside the home.
- Groups of parents who would like to form small virtual learning pods made up of neighborhood children so they can learn together in a small group, but need an appropriate learning space and/or broadband access for multiple devices.
- Teleworkers who need a more reliable wifi connection or who need a quiet space to work.
- Tutors working with students who are unable to meet elsewhere.
- College students enrolled in virtual learning.
- Adult literacy students.
- Homeschooling groups or other small learning groups who need space to accommodate up to 12 people for more active, in-person learning.

You can begin placing your reservations on Sept. 1 for spaces that will be available starting Sept. 8. All spaces will include seating and free wifi. Additional amenities may include tables, whiteboards, access to power outlets and enclosed rooms for group learning or collaboration.



Dan Gemeinhart

THE BOOK OF LONGINGS by Sue Monk Kidd


Ana, the daughter of Herod Antipas' scribe, lives in Galilee and spends her days in scholarly pursuits with dreams of recording the histories of forgotten women. She unwillingly becomes betrothed to an elderly widower who, to Ana's relief, dies shortly before the ceremony. Determined to escape her eventual plight, she flees and becomes a friend of 18-year-old Jesus. They soon discover similarities in intellect and disposition as well as a mutual attraction. Ana leaves her family riches behind and moves to Nazareth to join the family compound of Jesus. The author, Sue Monk Kidd, imagines the unrecorded years of Jesus' life before the beginning of his ministry. She enables the reader to walk in the shoes of Ana as she and her husband navigate the difficult life of educated compassionate citizens during the rule of the Roman Empire.

DAISY JONES & THE SIX by Taylor Jenkins Reid


Coming of age in the late 60s, Daisy Jones is without boundaries in a world of drugs, sex, and rock and roll. Complicated tensions soon develop between somber Billy and free-wheeling Daisy, but it becomes apparent that the road to success hinges on their partnership as song writers and duet performers. **Daisy Jones and The Six** rise quickly to the top and bask in the adoration of fans who have no idea of the chaos behind the curtain. This fascinating novel is written as an oral history with interviews of band members, managers, and crew decades after stardom – a history with conflicting memories and heart wrenching emotion.

THE LIBRARY BOOK by Susan Orlean

In April of 1986, Los Angeles Central Library experienced the most devastating library fire in American history. Burning for 7 hours, over one million books were destroyed or severely damaged. The Fire Inspectors declared it arson and focused their investigation on Harry Peak, an unstable aspiring actor who altered his alibi daily. Orlean delivers a work of true crime as well as a history of Central Library beginning with its founding in 1872. She expertly weaves the eerie story of Harry and his possible involvement along with a narrative exploration of the daily inner workings of various library departments serving the diverse population of Los Angeles. **The Library Book** is brimming with details enabling the reader to fully appreciate that libraries are depositories for information sources as well as community centers and sanctuaries free and available to all.




